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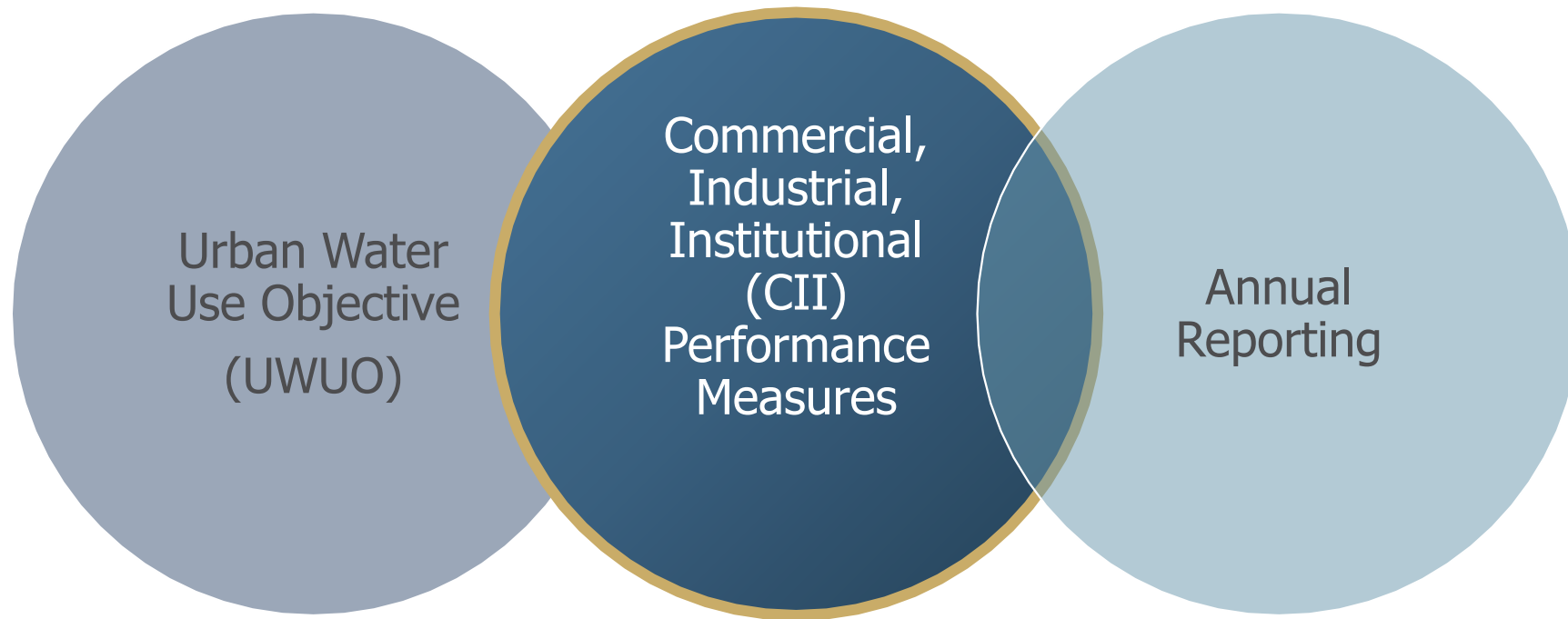
CONSERVATION REGULATION

- The State Water Resource Control Board adopted the Making Conservation a California Way of Life regulation on July 3, 2024
- Implements AB 1668 and SB 606 signed into law in 2018
- The two regulations create the framework to establish unique goals for each urban water supplier to achieve long-term water use efficiency



MAKING CONSERVATION A CALIFORNIA WAY OF LIFE REGULATION

- Urban retail water suppliers must comply with three major components

CII CLASSIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Annually report total number of classified CII accounts in each of the 22 categories
- All CII accounts must be classified by June 30, 2027
- Maintain a 95 percent classification rate of all CII accounts
